

Your pool contains a large quantity of water, and is deep enough to present inherent dangers to life and health unless the following safety rules are strictly observed. First-time users run the highest risk of injury. Make sure everyone understands. To insure your pool is used safely you **must** observe the following safety precautions:

1. NO JUMPING OR DIVING

The top rail of your pool is not a walkway and must not be used for jumping or diving. Do not permit jumping or diving into the pool from a deck or the top rail of the pool. Diving or jumping into the pool can result in serious injury.

2. NEVER USE THE POOL ALONE

Never permit the pool to be used unless it is attended by at least one person other than the bather. Someone should always be available to lend assistance in an emergency.

3. NEVER LEAVE CHILDREN UNATTENDED

Never leave a child alone and unsupervised in or near the pool—not even for a second. There is no substitute for constant adult supervision.

4. NO ROUGH PLAY

Do not permit "rough-playin" in and around your pool. Surfaces can become slippery and hazardous when wet.

5. LIGHT THE POOL AT NIGHT

If the pool is used after dusk, adequate lighting must be provided. Illumination in the pool area must be sufficient to clearly judge pool depth and all features in and around the pool. For lighting recommendations, consult your local licensed electrical contractor

6. RESTRICT ACCESS TO THE POOL

Do not leave chairs or other furniture beside the pool that could be used by a child to climb up into the pool. Ladders must be removed whenever the pool is unattended. A fence with a lockable gate around the pool or yard is strongly recommended and may be required by law in some jurisdictions.

7. NO ALCOHOL OR DRUGS

Never drink alcoholic beverages or use any intoxicants which could hinder your judgment and reflexes.

8. KEEP YOUR POOL CLEAN AND SANITARY

Your filter system will remove suspended particles from the water and the surface skimmer will remove insects, leaves and other debris from the water surface. Use the correct pool chemicals as directed to destroy harmful bacteria and prevent formation of algae. Remember, unsanitary water is a serious health hazard.







Read all instructions completely before you begin.

A. DETERMINE THE LOCATION OF YOUR POOL

1. The Terrain

Pay special attention to choosing the right location for your pool:

• Choose a large area, as flat and level as possible and well drained. (*Image 1*)


• Choose a spot on dry, firm earth (stabilizer or other)—do not install the pool on asphalt, tar or oil based surfaces, gravel, peat moss, wood or chemically treated soil.


• Check with your pool dealer to see if Nut Grass grows in your area. This type of grass may grow up through your pool liner. Your dealer will be able to advise how best to treat the site.


• Sloped areas will need to be made level by digging away high spots, not by filling low spots—be prepared to hire earth-moving equipment if necessary. (*Images 2a & 2b*)

• Ensure the earth is well compacted and a wall is placed to prevent the earth from seeping out. *(Image 2a)*

• If you need to install partly in the ground, you must contact your dealer to see if this is an option for you and that you meet law requirements in your jurisdiction. *(Image 2c)*







Important Note:

Ground preparation is one of the most important steps in the installation process. A proper foundation will ensure the rest of the pool assembly goes smoothly and that no problems will occur when the pool is filled with water.

2. Things to Avoid

Do not locate your pool near or on any of the following *(Images 3a to 3c)*:

- Overhanging tree branches.
- Overhead wires and clotheslines.

• Buried pipes and wires. Contact your gas, electric and telephone utilities to find buried pipes and wires before you dig.

• Areas with poor drainage.


• Grass, stones and roots. Grass will rot underneath the pool liner, and stones and roots will damage the pool liner.

• Areas recently treated with oil-based weed killers, chemicals or fertilizers.

3. Plan Ahead


• Will you be adding an adjacent deck later? Be sure to leave room.

• Will you be using pool accessories or other appliances that need electricity or gas? Locate your pool near these services or plan to have them installed later by a licensed contractor.



Important Note:

When locating the centre of the pool, be sure to take into consideration any structures (deck, patio, house) or relevant items (change rooms, gazebo, etc.) that the pool may need to line up with and ensure that the pool is in the most visual pleasing location for your property.

B. PREPARE THE FOUNDATION OF YOUR POOL

1. Mark out the Area


a. The next following steps will show you how to mark out the area you need for the oval pool. This marked area will be larger than the pool size itself, but this space is needed. Find a site where the ground is stable, level and well drained. Once you have selected your site, determine where the middle of your pool will be.



Please see in the next page for an **EXAMPLE** on how to correctly mark your pool area.


- b. Drive a peg into the ground at the centre point. *(Image 1)*
- c. Now you must make the round ends that will be the oval part. In order to do so, you will have to determine the center of the radius on each side and drive a peg into the ground. *(Image 2)*
- d. Using a length of string tied between the peg and a can of spray paint mark the circles on the ground. *(Image 3)*
- e. Once the center has been established, and the measurement of the pool itself has been determinded, you must now determine the outer limits of the perimeter of your pool. Add 12" (30 cm) inside this measurement to determine pool perimeter. *(Image 4)*





B. CONT. PREPARE THE FOUNDATION OF YOUR POOL

f. Mark areas along both straight sides of your oval. Use pegs and string as a guide for the can of spray paint to mark straight lines. *(Image 5)*



g. You now have the space marked out that is needed for your oval pool. *(Image 6)*

2. Remove the sod

- a. Remove the sod from the area you have just outlined. *(Image 7)*
- b. Remove all debris (rocks, roots, etc) using a rake. Then compact the ground to achieve a firm base.








3. Make the area flat and level

- a. Remove all the high spots with a shovel, hoe or rake. To make sure your pool is stable, compact the ground well before adding the sand. Be prepared to hire earth moving equipment if you need to level a large area. Remember, your pool must be level across the diameter of the pool. (Image 8)
- b. Small dips and hollows may be filled in, but the soil must be hard-packed with a tamping tool.
- c. Take material such as rock dust or fine mortar that can conform a solid, permanent base and deposit this material around the rim of the basin. *(Image 9)*
- d. The material used should be spread around the perimeter of the pool to a width of 24" (60cm) and a thickness of 2" (5cm). *(Image 10)*
- e. Recheck the outer perimeter of the oval shape, where the pool wall will be placed. Compact the ground and make sure there are no high or low spots. The bottom edge of the pool wall must rest flat on the ground and have no gaps under it.





Helpful Hint:

Use the optical level to ensure that the ground is perfectly flat and level.

Your pool must be perfectly level. Take the time you need to be sure your foundation is perfectly level.

- b. In order to ensure that your line is perpendicular, measure from each radius center to the top of your line. The measurement should be exactly the same on each side. If not, adjust until both are the same and you will now have a perfect perpendicular line, therfore creating a perfect 90 degree angle. (Images 12 & 13)

c. Repeat the first two steps to create a perpendicular line in order to create a perfect 90 degree angle for the other side of the oval pool.


5. Placing the buttress

Odd number of trenches;

a. If your oval pool contains an even number of buttresses, please proceed with next step b. If your oval pool contains an odd number, position the buttress temporarily on the straight center line from the middle. (*Image 14*) Continue to step c. Note: Odd number means the total of sections on one side, for example a 12 x 24 pool has Odd number.

b. If your oval pool contains an even number of buttresses, measure from the center line out the required measurement as per your footprint, see the last pages in this section 1. Position the buttress temporarily off the straight center line from the middle. *(Image 15) Continue to step c. 





- d. Spread a layer of crushed limestone (or equivalent) 3/4" (19 mm) thick into the bottom of each trench. Pack firmly. If you do not put crushed stone, understand that the bottom plates all around the pool must be at the same level. The warranty will void if you do not comply with this requirement
- Place a concrete patio stone 12" x 12" square x 2" thick (30 x 30 x 5 cm) into the wide part of each patio stone trench, on top of the limestone layer. Make sure it is LEVEL and positioned correctly. (*Images 17 -19*)








🚹 Important Note:

Crushed limestone or equivalent **must** be used instead of brick sand or vermiculite to backfill the base U-channels. The level of compaction achieved by using crushed limestone or equivalent is superior to that of brick sand or vermiculite.






D. ASSEMBLING THE BUTTRESS

1. Strap preparation for the buttresses

- a. Gently flatten any kinks or bends out of the straps. Lay the strap across the levelled area for the pool as shown in diagram 20 and centre the srap over the patio stone. *(Image 20)*
- b. Space the end of the strap 2" (5cm) from the outside edge of the patio stone. *(Image 21)*
- c. Fasten one diagonal bracket (key 4) to the strap (key 8) using four 3/4" long bolts (key 21) and nuts (key 10). Make sure the angled part of the bracket is facing the correct direction as shown in diagram 22. The surface that the diagonal bracket is fastened to will be the top of the strap.
- d. Repeat steps (a) to (c) for the other end of the straps.







Caution:


Make sure there is adequate drainage in the bottom of each trench and along the sides of the pool area. There must be adequate drainage for a safe and secure pool foundation.






2. Installing the Upright

- a. Using a straight edge (you can use one of the hold down plates), drag along the top edge of the strap to ensure the ground is exactly even and level with the strap (the area 24" (61 cm) beyond each side of the strap must be level too). If it is not level, spread some crushed limestone (or equivalent) on the ground. Stand on the strap and tamp it down hard with a tamping tool. Verify the ground is level to the strap by running the straight edge along the top edge of the strap. Repeat this step until the ground is level. *(Image 23)*
- b. Gently lift the strap and insert four 3/4" long bolts (key 21) into the holes closest to the centre of the pool. Ensure the bolt heads are facing the ground. Lay the strap back down on the ground and place the hold down plate and base plate (as shown in diagram 24) over the bolts protruding from the strap and fasten the nuts to the bolts and tighten. *(Images 24 to 26)*














c. Fasten one upright (key 1) to the base plate using three 3/4" long bolts (key 21) and nuts (key 10). Make sure the bottom end of the upright is fastened to the base plate. The bottom end of the upright has three large holes which are used to fasten to the base plate. *(Image 27)*

Caution:

Failure to properly install and tighten all of the bolts and nuts may void the warranty on your pool.

- e. When you come to Section 2, you will install the bottom rails, linking them to the buttresses. Make sure now that there is approximately 1/16" (2 mm) gap under the tab at the bottom of each upright so the bottom rails slide on easily. *(Image 28)*
- f. Continue assembling the remaining buttresses.

3. Install the Diagonals

- Hold one diagonal brace (key 2) approximately horizontal, insert the four tabs at the end of the diagonal into the а slots in the upright (key 1). (Image 29)
- Pull upward on the inserted end of the diagonal to make the tabs slide up and lock into position in the slots. At b. the same time, swing the other end of the diagonal down onto the diagonal bracket (key 4) on the base channel. (see diagrams 30 & 31)

29 30 Very important: as you swing the diagonal down, make sure you apply constant upward pressure on the end of the diagonal brace with the tabs to ensure they stay fully locked in position in the slots. c. 



4. Buttress Location Verification

- a. Make sure the base channels are exactly lined up with each other. Stand at each corner of the pool and check the alignment of the base channels by using strings attached to each buttress. *(Image 33)*
- b. Please read Section 2 step 1 (a) and complete steps 1(b) and (c). This will allow you to install the bottom buttress rails, ensuring the correct distance between the buttresses. Important: complete only steps 1(a) to (c) for now, and then continue with step 5 below; you will complete the rest of Section 2 later.

5. Fill in the Hold Down Plates


- a. Standing on the hold down plate, insert material into all open voids on the outside edges of the hold down plates until they are full. These voids are the open areas between the ground and the top edges of the hold down plate. This will prevent any low spots from forming around the hold down plates when the pool is filled with water. (*Image 34*)
- Important: Make sure each hold down plate lies completely flat. The hold down plate must lie flat or it may lift and damage the pool liner after the pool is filled with water. (Image 35)
- b. Repeat step (a) for the other hold down plates.
- c. Once all the trenches are dug and buttresses with patio stones are installed. Remeasure each buttress to ensure that they are all straight and that the buttress is perpendicular.

1. Install the curved bottom rails

Each pool uses two, three or four different types of curved bottom rails. *(Image 1)* Please refer to your pool footprint (at the end of Section 1) in order to recognize where each type of bottom rail should be placed.

The 18 x 33 pool is the only size that uses all four types of rails. The image below shows the locations for each type.





b. If the pool has been supplied with resin rail supports, slide the resin rail support to the middle of the buttress bottom rail as shown in *image 2 and 3*. Repeat this step for all other butress bottom rails.

NOTE: If you have a 12 x 18 pool proceed to step (d).











- c. Insert the buttress rails (key 13) between the buttresses (if you have a 12 x 18 pool, skip step (c) and go to step (d)). The bottom rails insert into the notch in the upright. Make sure the groove faces up.
- d. Insert the transition A rails (key 13). Slide one end of each rail into the notch in the upright (see diagrams 5 and 6) and slide the other end together with a base plate (key 14 see diagrams 9 to 12 on next page).

Important: make sure you slide the rail into the notch so the closed, square part of the rail is in the notch, not the open groove part of the rail (see diagrams 7 & 8).











When measuring the distance to the face of each base plate, use a piece of string longer than required and place a mark on the string at the required distance.

- e. Slide the other end of the transition A rail together with a base plate (key 14). *(Images 10 to 12)*
- f. If you have an 18 x 33 pool, insert the transition B rails (if you have any other size pool, skip to step (f)). Leave a 1/2" (13 mm) gap between the ends of the rails (see diagram 1 on the previous page for the 18 x 33 pool).
- g. Lay out the end rails and base plates on both rounds ends of the pool area. Refer to your pool's footprint to ensure correct dimension. (Note: this step will not work on the buttress rails or transition rails.)
- h. Insert the end rails. Leave a 1/2" (13 mm) gap between the ends of the rails.







Important Note:


Bend the first 1/8" (3 mm) of the end of the bottom rail slightly with a pair of pliers to make sure the rail doesn't slide out of the base plate when the pool wall is installed.

Cut several small pieces of wood approximately 1/2" x 3/8" (1.5cm x .9cm) square and place one between the two bottom rails located at each base plate. This will keep the bottom rails from closing while the wall is installed. Be sure to remove the blocks of wood later, before installing the uprights in Section 4.

2. Patio Stones (Optional)-Round Section

- a. Concrete patio stones may be placed at the base of each upright of your pool. *(Image 13)*
- b. Each bottom plate will show the location for a patio stone. Make a mark in the ground at each base plate.
- c. Remove the bottom rails and bottom plates and lay out the patio stones around the circle where the bottom plates were.
- d. The patio stones must be sunk into the ground so the tops are flush with the soil around them. Use the carpenter's level to make sure the patio stones are perfectly level and flush with the ground. Use either the carpenter's level and a 2-by-4 (5cm x 10cm) wood plank, or the optical level between patio stones to make sure the stones are level with each other. *(Image 14)*
- e. Do not install blocks or rails on loose sifted soil or sand. There must be no space between the ground and the bottom of the rails. All patio blocks must be flush with the ground, solid and level with each other in all directions.
- NOTE: Installing patio blocks is optional and the blocks may shift due to temperature changes.





Important Note:

Make sure the patio stones are perfectly level and flush with the ground. All patio blocks must be flush with the ground, solid and level with each other in all directions

A. CONT. ASSEMBLING POOL BASE & SIDE STRUCTURE

3. Spread out Brick Sand

- a. Make sure any screw or bolt heads that are to be covered with sand or styrofoam are covered with duct tape first.
- b. Fill in all of the trenches completely with crushed limestone.
- c. Spread a layer of fine brick sand (no pebbles) over the foundation area, 2" (5 cm) deep. Use a rake to make the brick sand flat and smooth. Instead of brick sand, you can use 1" or 1-1/2" (25 or 38 mm) thick sheets of styrofoam. Cut the sheets to fit. Remove the Styrofoam until the wall is installed. Reinstall the styrofoam sheets and join them with duct tape along the whole length of each seam. Remember to wait until the pool wall has been installed before installing the Styrofoam. (*Image 15*)

Important Note:

Spread brick sand or sheets of styrofoam out over the entire pool foundation area inside the base rails. This provides a protective surface for the pool liner to rest on.

4. Proceed to Section 3 -Assembling Pool wall and Liner

A. SETTING UP THE POOL WALL

Do not attempt to install the pool wall in the wind, wait for a calm day. It takes at least 3 people to install the pool wall.

1. Preparing for the wall installation

- a. Bring the following items into the middle of the pool foundation before you start uncoiling the pool wall: plywood, some extra sand or fine dirt to make the cove and a ladder to climb out after the wall is assembled.
- b. Make sure the skimmer and water return holes are located where you need them to be. The skimmer and water return holes are positioned towards the end of the wall, **(the section before where the wall started).**

Important Note:


Be sure to use a measuring tape and measure the whole perimeter of the pool by measuring from the inside of the bottom rails.

2. Set the pool wall in place.

- a. Unpackage the coiled pool wall and stand it on the plywood at the place close to where you need to install the skimmer. *(Image 1)*(Remember the skimmer and water return holes will be placed at the section just before where you started the wall installation).
- b. Start uncoiling the wall, guiding the bottom edge into the curved bottom rail. The starting end of the wall must be positioned in the centre of a bottom plate, and the skimmer and return holes should be positioned where the pump and filter will be. *(Images 2 to 4)*
- NOTE: It is important that the pool wall be evenly distributed at both ends of the pool to ensure that all the top rails fit. As the wall is uncoiled and placed into the bottom rails it is important to maintain approximately 1/2" (13mm) gap between the bottom rails or the top rails may not fit.

Important Note:

Secure the slotted tube to the wall with a piece of duct tape after installation to prevent it from lifting off the wall.





3. Installation of the slotted tube.

a. As you erect the wall, install the slotted tubes to obtain greater stability. Please refer to your pool's footprint in Section 1 in order to know where to place the correct lengths. As you set lengths of slotted tube onto the top edge of the wall while you uncoil it, join the slotted tubes with connectors as you go, leaving a 1/2" (13 mm) gap between each. (If you have a beaded pool liner, set lengths of liner retainer on the top edge of the wall first, then the slotted tubes and connectors.)

The 18 x 33 pool is the only size that uses all four types of slotted tubes. *Image 5* below shows the locations for each type.

Note: Using a 2"(5cm) piece of duct tape, tape the ends of the 6"(15cm) metal slotted tube connector over the slotted tubes and onto the pool wall. This will prevent the slotted tubes from moving during the liner installation.




4. Installation of the wall

a. Continue installing the wall around the foundation until the entire pool wall is uncoiled into the bottom rails and the top edge is covered with the slotted tube and connectors (and beaded liner retainers if you have a beaded pool liner).

NOTE: We also suggest installing vinyl-covered hooks and rope to hold the wall steady. *(Image 6)*

- b. At the top of each buttress, make sure the distance between the ends of the slotted tubes on the top edge of the wall is 4" (10 cm). Insert the plastic tube (key A) into the inside of the slotted tubes (key B) to fill the 4" (10 cm) space. The plastic tubes are inserted only in the spaces along the straight sides of the pool where the buttresses are located, not around the round ends of the pool. Make sure the plastic tubes are correctly installed or else when you install the top plates later they will not fit properly. (Image 7)
- c. After the wall is installed, go around the entire pool and make sure all the gaps between the bottom rails are equal in size (the gaps may each finish slightly smaller or larger than 1/2" (13 mm), check your pool's footprint for gap size). Recheck all of the bottom plates to make sure each one is centred between the bottom rails.
- d. After the pool wall has been installed, reconfirm distances to the base plates. Make sure the round ends of the pool have been properly located or the pool wall will not be symmetrical

5. Join the ends of the pool wall

- a. Line up the holes in the two ends of the pool wall. *(Image 8)*
- b. Now that you have installed the wall you can be faced with three scenarios.

1) The wall joints align perfectly, if so, move on to the next step (c).

2) Your wall appears to be too short. **It is not.** However the space between the bottom rails must be decreased by lightly tapping the bottom plates towards the inside of the pool. You can also tap the wall lightly with both hands in the desired direction. *(Image 9)*

You MUST recheck the gaps at each and every one of the bottom rails so that they are all equal in gap size.

3) Your wall appears too long. **It is not.** However the space between the bottom rails must be increased by tapping the bottom plates lightly towards the outside of the pool or by tapping the wall with both hands in the desired direction. *(Image 10)*

You MUST recheck the gaps at each and every one of the bottom rails so that they are all equal in gap size.


c. Recheck the position of the upright, refer to your pool's footprint diagram.

Important Note:

Bottom rails must always be held in place in the bottom plate.


d. To fasten the wall joint, overlap the two steel bars, one on the inside and the other on the outside. Tighten the mechanical screws on the inside and the nuts on the outside. Ensure that all bolts and all the holes are used. (*Image 11*)

Important Note:

Stick a screwdriver through two of the holes to help line up the ends of the wall.

When tightening the screws start from either the top and go down or vice versa. Do not start a few screws from top and a few from the bottom to meet in the middle, this can cause problems later on.

- e. Adjusting the pool to the proper shape may cause the bottom rails and bottom plates to slip out of alignment a little. Recheck all of the bottom plates to make sure each one is centred where the bottom rails meet.
- f. Cover the seam and bolt heads on the inside/interior of the pool wall completely with 2" (50mm) duct tape. *(Image 12)*
- g. Where there are no buttresses installed, the space between the ends of the slotted tubes at the tops of the verticals should be about 1/2" (13 mm).



Important Note:

The pool must be level across the perimeter. A pool that is not level is dangerous and may collapse.






B. ASSEMBLING THE COVE

1. Make the cove

- a. If you are using sand, bank the sand against the wall to form a cove of 3" to 6" (7.5cm to 15cm) high and 8" to 12" (20cm to 30cm) wide at ground level. This will prevent the liner from creeping under the wall, and it will also protect the liner from any metal edges of the pool framework. THIS STEP IS NOT OPTIONAL, IT MUST BE DONE. (*Image 13*)
- b. Water the sand to compact it and use a trowel to spread it evenly. *(Image 14)*
- c. Since earth containing chemicals can cause discoloration or corrosion, it is suggested that you place **polyethylene plastic sheeting** under the cove around the perimeter of the wall, so no earth comes in contact with the metal. Since the presence of such chemicals is beyond the control of the manufacturer, such damage is not covered under warranty. *(Image 15)*
- d. If you are using styrofoam cove pieces instead of sand, insert them in the bottom rail and refer to the installation instructions that are provided with them.







Important Note:

The cove is an important part of the pool structure. Take your time to make a complete, full-size cove.



B. CONT. ASSEMBLING THE COVE

e. A vacuum cleaner can later be used to remove the air from between the liner and the wall. This technique enables you to remove folds in the liner. However the following precautions should be taken:


Do not use an industrial vacuum cleaner which could be too powerful.

Tape the end of the vacuum hose before inserting it into the wall so as not to damage the liner.

Insert the nozzle until it is about 4" (10cm) above the cove (insert through the water return outlet or the skimmer depending on the diameter of your hose). Make sure you will be able to remove the hose later on. Tape the hose to the wall. *(Image 16)*

f. Close the skimmer opening with cardboard and adhesive tape so that the suction of air works better. *(Image 17)*

1. Set the liner in place


- a. Open the carton. Do not use anything sharp to open the carton.
- b. Unpack and unfold the liner and spread it out in the sun to warm it up. Inspect all the seams and surfaces for holes.
- c. Remove your shoes to avoid damaging the base or tearing the liner.
- d. Spread out the liner, smooth side down. Unfold the liner from the centre of the pool toward the sides. (*Image 18*)
- e. Use the liner's bottom seam(s) as a guide and make sure the seam(s) are parallel to the straight sections and to the imaginary line which links points A and B in the illustration *(Image 19)*. It is recommended that you begin installing the liner in a round section.
- f. Use the liner's vertical seam as a guide and make sure the seam is vertical and perpendicular to the wall and bottom.
- g. Make sure the seam between the wall and bottom is centred on the cove *(Image 20)*
- h. Smooth out all the wrinkles in the bottom. Do not leave any space between the liner and cove.

Important Note:

If possible, unfold the liner on the grass one to two hours before installation. Be careful not to leave the liner too long or you may damage the grass.

Mimportant Note:

The liner is generally smaller than the support structure of the pool. It will stretch more easily when warm. It is important that the liner is installed on a warm sunny day.

Please ensure to follow instructions that match the type of liner you may have.


2. Fasten the liner place 2-1. FOR OVERLAP ONLY (Please see step 2-2. or 2-3. for other liner)

- a. Starting at the liner wall seam, hang the liner over the slotted tube making sure that the seam is straight up and down, perpendicular to the floor. This will assure you that the liner begins going over the wall straight. *(Image 21)*
- b. As you put the liner over the wall you can secure it by using the plastic coping strips to keep it in place. If you end up with excess material, continue around the pool, pulling excess liner evenly, and distribute over the wall until the excess is gone. *(Image22)*
- c. Fasten the liner to the top of the wall with plastic coping. Let the liner hang slack for now. Do not pull the liner tight. (*Image 23*)
- NOTE: Some liners may fit very tightly, it is better to install uprights, top plate and rail before going onto next step. See Section 4.
- d. Turn the vacuum cleaner on and push the liner outward with your feet to iron out any wrinkles. Once finished, turn off vacuum cleaner.
- e. Start filling the pool with water. As the pool fills, work out all the wrinkles and smooth the liner to the wall. Remove the plastic coping around the top edge of the wall one piece at a time and adjust the liner. Keep smoothing out the wrinkles.

MImportant Note:

Do not trim off the excess liner. (If the liner ever needs to be removed, trimming the liner will make re-installation very difficult.) Instead, roll up any excess liner and tape it in place near the top of the pool wall.

3. Proceed to Section 4 -Installing the Pool Frame



2-2. For HUNG/J or V-BEAD LINER ONLY (Please see step 2-1. or 2-3. for other liner)

- a. With a V-Bead liner coping is not needed. You can discard those pieces (if they are included).
- b. The top of the wall of the liner has what is called a "V-Bead" welded onto it. Simply open up the bead with your fingers and hang it directly on top of the pool wall. When this is done properly, the only portion on the outside of the pool wall is approximately 1" of the V-Bead. No printed liner material is actually going over the top of the wall to the outside of the wall. (*Image 24*)
- c. Make sure the bead is on evenly around the entire pool, and that the liner is hanging straight down from the top of the wall. The liner should not have creases in it because it is twisting around the pool. If the liner is twisting, it is because it is not sitting properly in the pool. Make necessary adjustments before proceeding.



NOTE: Some liners may fit very tightly, it is better to install uprights, top plate and rail before going onto next step. See Section 4.

Important Note:



3. Proceed to Section 4 -Installing the Pool Frame

C. CONT. INSTALL THE POOL LINER

2-3. For BEADLOCK/SNAPBEAD LINER ONLY (Please see step 2-1. or 2-2. for other liner)

- With a snap bead liner you will not use the plastic coping strips that are packed in the parts carton of many pools. You can discard those pieces (if they are included). Instead, you should have received a beaded liner track (referred to as a "coping bead receiver" in *Image 25*).
- b. The beaded liner track should be installed onto the pool wall all of the way around the pool. These pieces should be as close together as possible. Leaving spaces between bead tracks can cause liner problems later on.
- c. Once all of the beaded liner track is on the wall, you can snap the liner bead into the beaded liner track at four random points around the pool. After that is done, and you are satisfied with how the liner is situated within the pool, you can continue snapping the remainder of the liner into place around the pool.
- d. Go around the entire pool again making certain that the liner is securely snapped into the track. This is important to confirm so that the liner does not pull out while under the pressure of being filled with water.
- NOTE: Some liners may fit very tightly, it is better to install uprights, top plate and rail before going onto next step. See Section 4.



Mimportant Note:

Do not trim off the excess liner. (If the liner ever needs to be removed, trimming the liner will make re-installation very difficult). Instead, roll up any excess liner and tape it in place near the top of the pool wall.


1. Continue filling your Pool

- a. Continue filling your pool with water. Do not put in more than 12" (30 cm) of water until the top ledges and upright columns are all attached.
- b. Keep working on the top ledges and uprights while the pool fills.

See the drawing on the next page for an overview of all the parts used to install the uprights, top ledges and top connectors.

2. Install the uprights.

- a. Line up the bottom of one upright (key 1) with the two small tabs on one base plate (key 2). The tabs must be on the inside of the upright. The three holes on the front of the upright must be nearest the top.
- b. Line up the screw holes and fasten with one self-tapping screw on each side (key 3). *(Image 1)*
- c. Hook a top plate (key 4) over the top edge of the pool wall (key 5). Place the top plate down over the top of the upright with the tabs on the outside of the column. Make sure the upright is straight up and down.
- d. Line up the screw holes and fasten with one self-tapping screw on each side and one on the front (key 6).
- e. Repeat the last four steps for each of the upright around the pool wall.




Important Note:

Use the ridges in the pool wall to make sure the upright is straight up and down.


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
3. Install the top ledges-Round Section

- a. Place a top ledge (key 7) with one end on top of the top plate. The side of the top ledge facing the centre of the pool should be close to the pool liner and pool wall. The side of the top ledge facing the outside of the pool will form a large overhang. *(Image 3)*
- b. Line up the holes as shown. Fasten through the two oval holes into the holes marked 'A' in the top plate below with two self-tapping screws (key 8-Image 3). Do not tighten the screws yet. Leave the screws slightly loose until all the top ledges are in place.
- c. Repeat the last two steps for the other end of the top ledge.
- d. Repeat steps (a) to (c) to install the rest of the top ledges around the top of the pool wall.
- e. Make the pool settle into a perfect circle by pushing the top of the pool wall vigorously inward at each upright (this will help make the bottom of the pool wall shift into a perfect circle). *(Image 4)*
- f. Adjust all the top ledges to line up evenly with each other and tighten all the screws.

Important Note:

Make sure to refer to your parts listing for the measurements of the top ledges. This will help you to determine which top ledge to use for each pool section.


4. Install the Top Ledges-Straight Section


- NOTE: you must use any additional components that come with your pool and are required for proper assembly as described in this Section 4.
- a. Important: Make sure to refer to your parts listing for the measurements of the top ledges. This will help you to determine which top ledge to use for each pool section. Install all the side ledges (straight section) between the buttresses. Use hole 'A' and line up all of the holes as shown in *Image 6.* Fasten through the two oval holes to the top plate below with two self-tapping screws (key 9). Do not tighten any of the screws yet. Leave the screws slightly loose until all the top ledges are in place. Make sure the uprights are aligned straight up and down (Note: the 12' x 18' pool does not have side ledges).
- b. Install the remainvving top ledges in the straight section .


5. Install the Top Ledges-Transition Section

a. **Important:** Make sure to refer to your parts listing for the measurements of the top ledges. This will help you to determine which top ledge to use for each pool section. A top ledge that is over a buttress will fasten into the hole marked 'B' in the top plate, as shown in Image 6. For the rest of the end ledges (round section), use hole 'A' and line up all of the holes as shown in Image 7. Fasten through the two oval holes to the top plate below with twov screws (key 9).

Do not tighten any of the screws yet. Leave the screws slightly loose until all the top ledges are in place.









7. Install the Ledge Covers-Round Section

Note: your pool model may not contain a bottom ledge cover, therefore slip top ledge cover over the top ledges and continue to next pages Step (e).

- a. Loosen the front screw used to secure the top plate to the upright.
- b. Place a bottom ledge cover against an upright as shown. *(Image 8)*
- c. Slide the bottom ledge cover upwards until the slot on the ledge cover rest under the screw. *(Image 9)*
- d. Tighten the screw and repeat for the other uprights.
- IMPORTANT: When installing the top ledge cover, ensure the front lip of the ledge cover is over the top of the bottm ledge cover.







Transition Section

e. At the transition points only, where the end top ledge meets the side top ledge, make sure the side top ledge lines up properly with the end top ledge. If it doesn't line up, the ledge cover will appear crooked from above (*Image 11*). If the ledge cover isn't centered between the ledges, temporarily remove the ledge cover and loosen the screws on the top ledge. Shift the top ledge in or out from the center of the pool until the ledge cover can be properly centered between the top ledges. (*see Image 13*)








D. FILL YOUR POOL WITH WATER

1. Finish filling the pool

- a. Turn off the vacuum and carefully remove it from the pool.
- b. Fill the pool with water to 2" (5cm) below the lowest opening. Make sure you remove any creases from the liner in the bottom of the pool before the water level gets too high.
- c. While the pool is filling, remove the nails that were holding the bottom rails in place.
- d. Your pool is now installed. You must now install the filter and pump, the skimmer and water return inlet.Please follow the installation instructions that come with these products.



Important Note:

Before making any openings in the liner, fill the pool with 60cm (24") of water to stretch the liner fully. When filling your pool, begin with a garden hose until there is about 30cm (12") of water in the pool. This will allow the liner to stretch gradually. You can then use a heavier flow to finish filling it up.



POOL MAINTENANCE MAINTAINING YOUR POOL

POOL MAINTENANCE

Keep your pool wall and frame clean. Always wash away any deposits of pool chemicals which land on the frame of your pool. Wash periodically with a mild soap solution (no abrasives). At least once a year use a clear non-yellowing household wax on all metal components.

Your pool and liner must be inspected regularly for leaks, corrosion, scratches, and punctures. If any problem is found **IMMEDIATE CORRECTIVE ACTION MUST BE TAKEN**. Small repairs and punctures in your liner may be easily repaired using repair kits available at your local dealer. Scratches on your pool wall & frame must be touched up with anti-rust enamel. Wire brush all rust and add a coat of enamel primer followed by a coat of color matching paint. Pool water is full of various caustic chemicals, which will corrode metal parts. If any corrosion is allowed to continue, failure of the pool structure may occur which could result in excessive property damage as well as bodily harm.

The skimmer & return area and below it are particular areas that must be carefully and regularly inspected. If this area is wet, and remains wet for any length of time, it usually means there is a small leak. Skimmer/skimmer return gaskets must be replaced when they become defective. Water must not be permitted to continually run down the wall, if neglected pool will break. If proper skimmer return gasket care is not maintained, your warranty will be void!



Important Note:

Be sure to follow all local and state safety regulations when installing any accessory to your pool. Any decks, and all entries, must be carefully monitored for safety and access to pool. Installing any other manufacturer's deck or slide is strictly forbidden!

POOL MAINTENANCE WINTERIZING YOUR POOL

WINTERIZING YOUR POOL

Along with the cool nights of autumn comes the end of the swimming season. During the winter your pool is subject to more stress than in the summer, and any breakage that is caused by incorrect winter procedures is not subject to any warranty with this company.

All of our pools are designed to be left up all winter, but nonetheless are subject to the warranty that was purchased. Continue to chlorinate and filter until the pool is closed down. If you follow our recommendations, you will be able to winterize your pool properly in a few hours.

Properly winterizing your pool will protect it from damage and make it easier for you to reopen it when spring arrives.

The key to fast and easy winterization lies in regular treatment of the water until the start of the cold season, even if you haven't been using the pool.

Routine maintenance becomes easier and less frequent as the water gets cooler. In order to keep the water clean and clear and to prevent the liner from staining, we recommend closing your pool as late as possible, i.e. toward the end of September when the water temperature is about $10^{\circ}C$ ($50^{\circ}F$).

Waiting until you have finished closing the pool before shutting off the filtration system will prevent hoses still connected from freezing.

Follow the instructions on the following pages or contact your retailer for further information to ensure that you are protecting your pool properly.



POOL MAINTENANCE WINTERIZING YOUR POOL

WINTERIZING INSTRUCTIONS

For areas where water freezes make sure to follow these instructions before the water is frozen, otherwise do not touch the frozen water, this may damage the pool.

- a. Towards the end of the summer season or around mid-August, check for leaks by verifying if the pool's water level is stable. Draw a line on the liner marking the water level and wait 10 days. If after 10 days the level has dropped, then there is a leak. It is important to seal off any leaks you find. Leaks left unsealed when freezing begins can seriously damage your pool and even cause it to collapse.
- b. Vacuum carefully to remove all leaves and debris.
- c. Lower the water level so as to leave between 5 to 20 inches (12.5cm to 50cm) below the water return. Depending on your area and if the freezing point is more aggressive, for example 50% is frozen into ice, we strongly suggest to lowering the water to lowest point. Depending on how great the deep freeze in your area we suggest you consult with your local dealer about procedures on lowering the water level throughout the winter. We also suggest throughout the autumn season to continually check this level before freezing season starts, as it must not reach the skimmer holes at any time during the winter. Remove any snow which may accumulate on the top ledge.
- d. For the winter cover we suggest to lower the water level to 1 inch (2.5cm) below the water return. In some areas your dealer may ask you to install it differently in order to protect the pool and the cover. Contact your local dealer to verify the correct procedure for your pool.
- e. Remove and store the filter, ladder and all other removable parts from around the pool. The filter should be clear of any foreign objects and water should be removed from the filter and pump. See the manufacturer's instructions. Store the pump in a temperature controlled environment (so that it is not damaged by changes in temperature).



Important Note:

An unsealed leak may comprise or cancel the guarantee on your pool. Never leave water in any of the filtration system components due to the risk of damage during freezing.

POOL MAINTENANCE WINTERIZING YOUR POOL

WINTERIZING INSTRUCTIONS CONTINUED

- f. To maintain water quality, use a winter kit which contains an algicide and chlorine especially designed for this purpose. When it's time for spring cleaning, this will save you hours of work and reduce the cost of chemicals needed to restore your water quality.
- g. If using an autumn cover, make sure to place a ball underneath so that rainwater falls into the pool. An accumulation of too much water on the cover could place pressure on the pool, causing damage and invalidating the guarantee. Depending on how great the deep freeze in your area we suggest you consult with your local dealer about procedures on leaving the pool cover throughout the winter.
- h. If your pool has a bottom drain, you will have to use pool antifreeze to prevent it from freezing during the winter. Unscrew the hose from the base of the skimmer and attach an extension. Pass the extension over the wall of the pool, making sure it remains well attached. Pour antifreeze into the extension and thread a winterizing plug through the hose (tie a knot at the end of the tube that is to be inserted into the hose). Leave the valve open so that water can drain from the skimmer.

At the start of winter and spring, inspect the base of your pool for leaks.

Never let more than 30 cm (1') of snow accumulate on the pool wall; the wall is designed to support the lateral pressure of the pool water, not vertical pressure. With spring thaw, if water leaks from the skimmer or return outlet opening, place a tube at the opening so that the water will run off as far away from the basin of the pool as possible. PLEASE NOTE: Do not strike or hit a frozen pool. This would damage it. Do not disturb the pool till spring. If you have left the winter cover on the pool, make sure to remove accumulated snow after heavy snowfalls.

Important Note:

Whatever the type of valve or extension hose used, you must follow the technique described above to close your pool, otherwise your guarantee may be cancelled. Make sure to use antifreeze designed for pools.

POOL MAINTENANCE SPRINGTIME CLEANING OF YOUR POOL

PREPARING YOUR POOL IN THE SPRING

At the end of winter, allow the ice in the pool to thaw completely. When the temperature reaches approximately 10 °C (50 °F), you have to restart your filtration system, since algae and bacterial form more quickly as it gets warmer. Here is how to prepare your pool in a few simple easy steps.

- a. If your pool is equipped with a pool cover, remove the cover and cushion. Carefully remove with a hose any rainwater that has accumulated on the cover so it does not fall into your pool. Clean your cover and cushion and let them dry. Store them in a dry clean place.
- b. Attach the return inlet and skimmer to the filter. Bring the water level up to the middle of the skimmer. Get your filter working. Clean the bottom of the pool with the vacuum, taking care to place the filter in the "waste/drain" position. In this way you will eliminate particles of dirt without disturbing the sand in the filter, and will considerably reduce the need for "backwash rinsing" of the filter.
- c. Now that you have purified the water, you have to test it. It is very important that the pH level of your pool be between 7.6 and 7.8 and the pool's alkaline content be between 80 ppm and 130 ppm. If you are unable to attain these levels, please contact your retailer who will gladly do these tests for you.



Important Note:

Do not drain your pool to clean the water unless absolutely necessary (the water is recyclable). If you do empty your pool, don't leave it empty for too long or expose it to direct sunlight, as the liner may shrink.



POOL MAINTENANCE SPRINGTIME CLEANING OF YOUR POOL

PREPARING YOUR POOL IN THE SPRING CONTINUED

- d. When the pH and alkaline levels are ideal, apply a shock-treatment or chlorinate your water. Let it filter for 24 hours and again verify both the pH and free chlorine levels. NOTE: Add chemical products to your pool after sunset, as sunlight rapidly destroys chlorine.
- e. Let it filter for several days until the water is clear and the pH and free chlorine levels have stabilized. Add a conditioner/stabilizer by carefully following the manufacturer's instructions. This will stop the chlorine from evaporating quickly in sunlight. Add the quantity of algicide required to prevent algae.
- f. You may now begin regular maintenance of your pool. Don't forget to obtain a new set of solutions for your water analysis kit every spring. The old solutions may give false results.
- g. Make sure that the skimmer (screws and adapter) is properly in place and tighten the water return fittings to prevent leakage and premature rusting of the pool wall or the lower part of the bottom rail.
